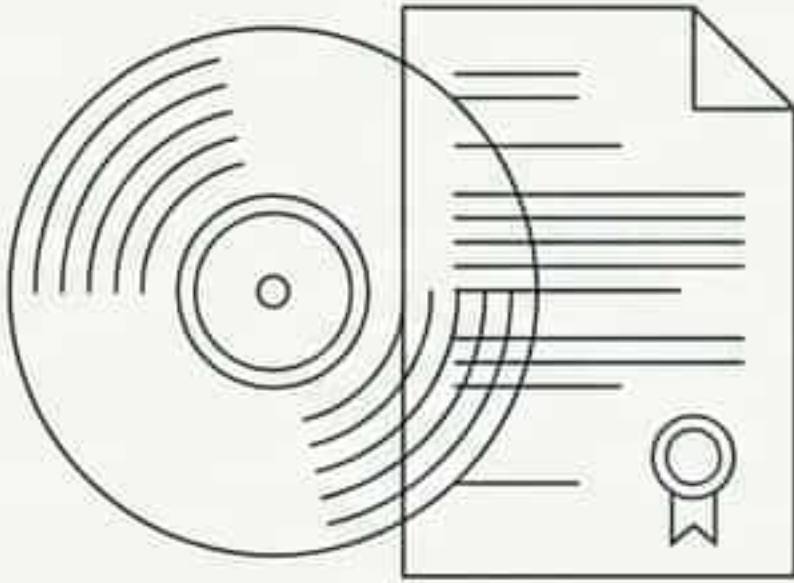

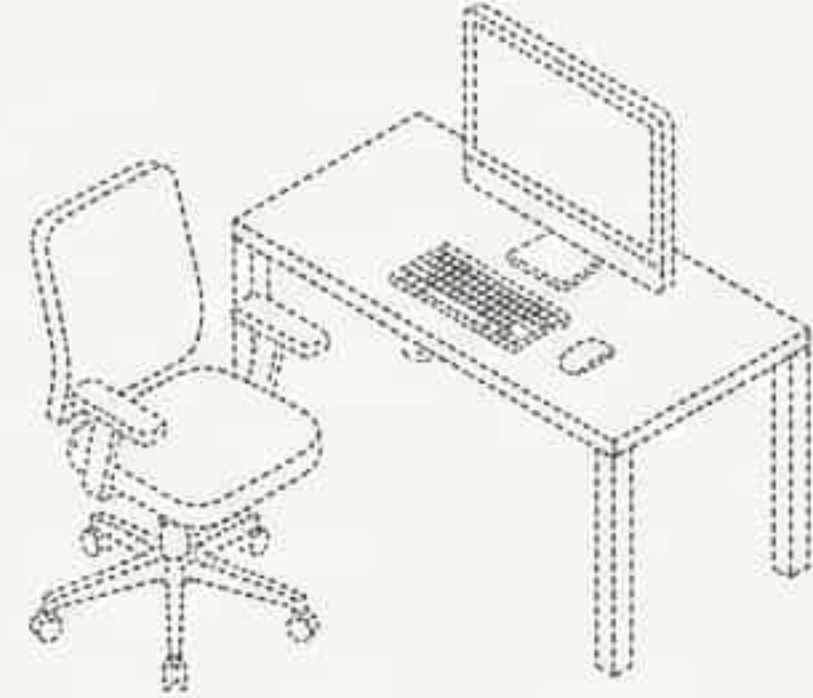
The Artifact

The Absence

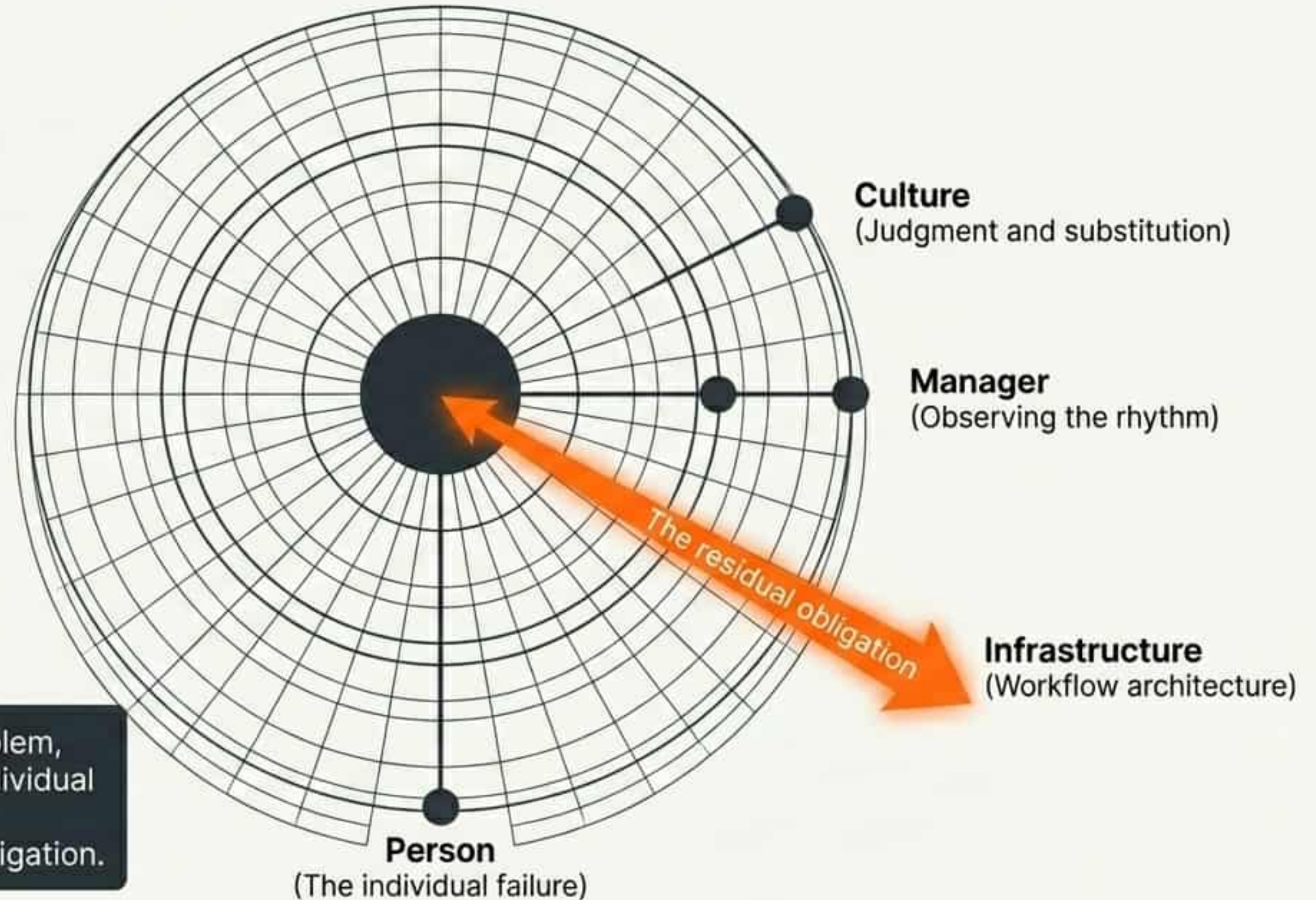

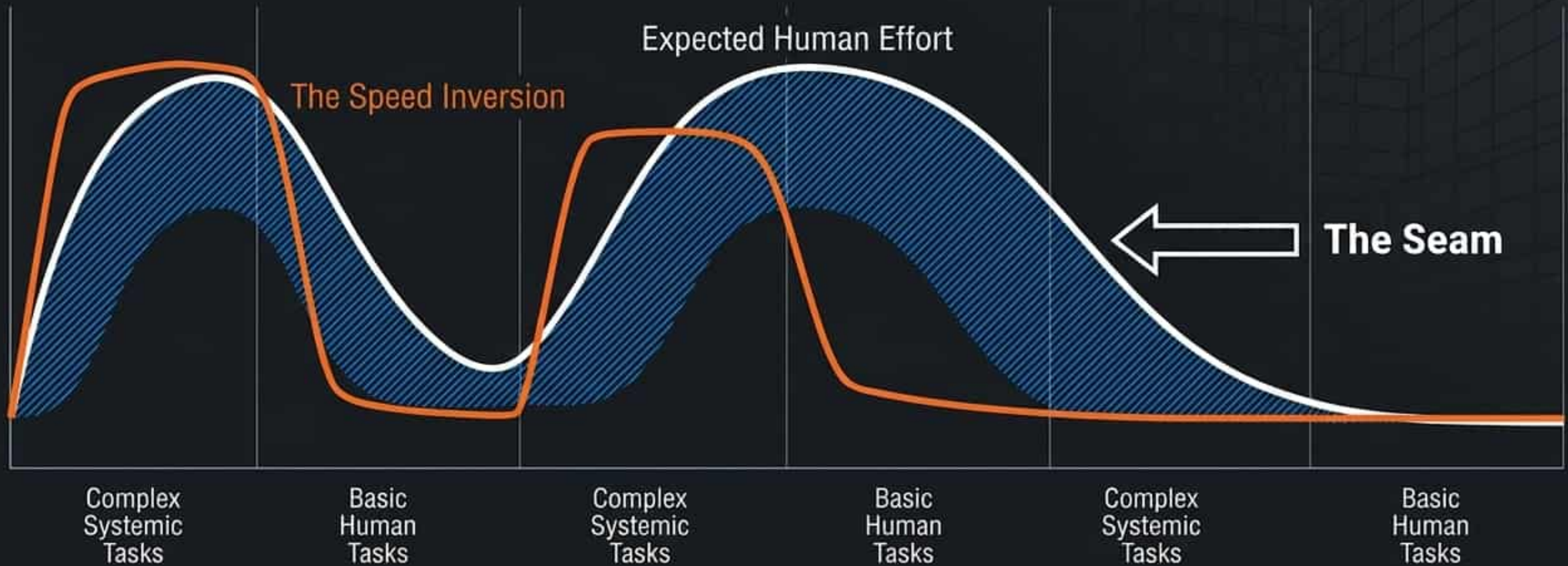
Firing someone for undisclosed AI use treats a symptom.
The deeper problem is structural—it is the distance between a tool and a mask.

Expanding the perimeter of accountability



To solve the AI governance problem, we must move outward from individual blame to systemic architecture, and finally back to individual obligation.

Reading the rhythm of metabolic work



Detection starts in the body before the report. It arrives as an institutional unease that the rhythm is off. The hard tasks are suspiciously easy. The easy tasks are suspiciously hard. The sequence of strain no longer matches the shape of the work.

Paranoia.

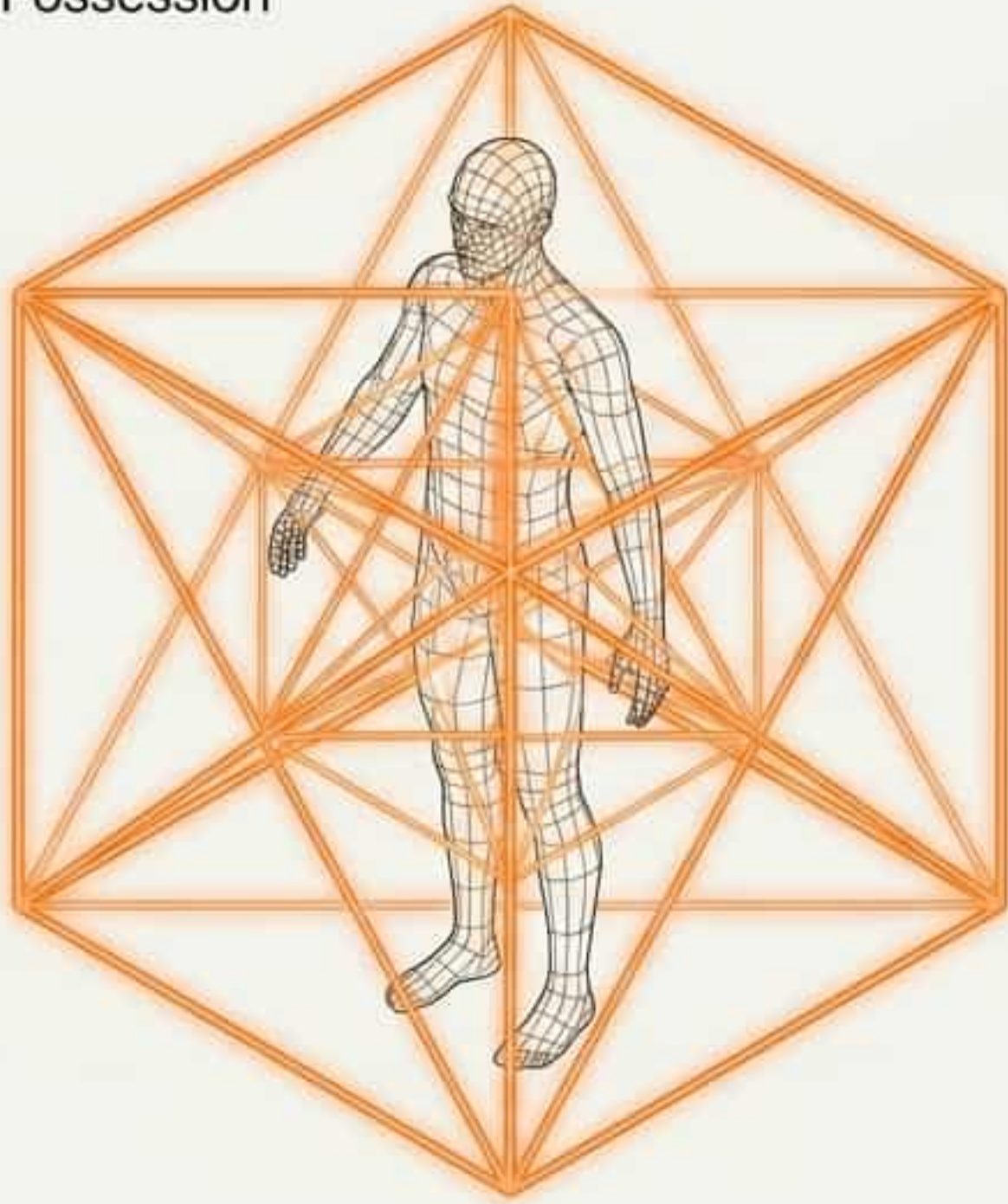
Admiring polished outputs while losing contact with comprehension. **Naivete.**

The Calibration Question:
I notice the hard part seemed instant and the easy part took three days. Walk me through how you approached it.

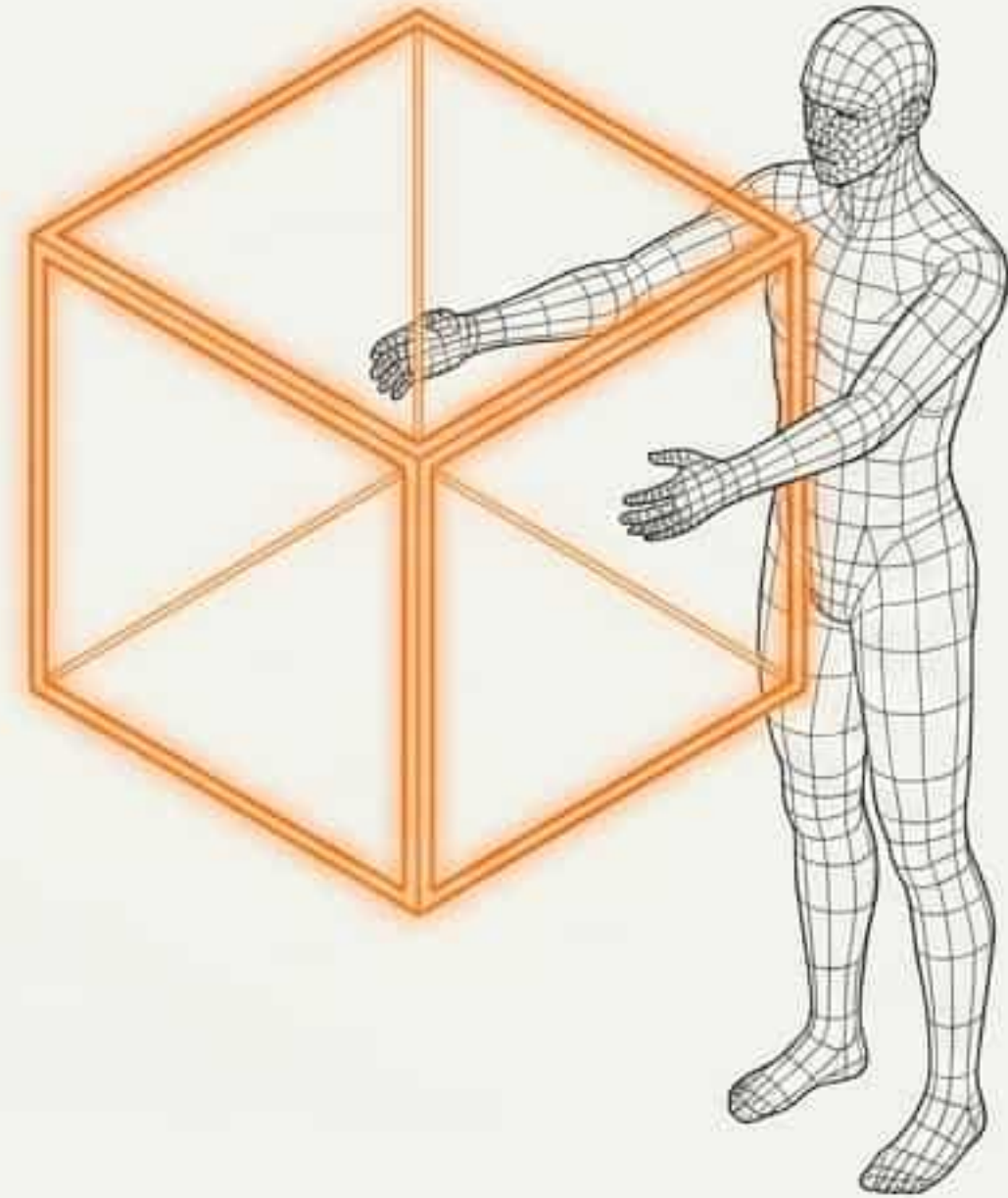
The Goal: Keep detection inside the social contract. Create space for legitimate support, hidden blockers, or open tool use to be disclosed.

The gap between proximity and possession

Model A: Possession

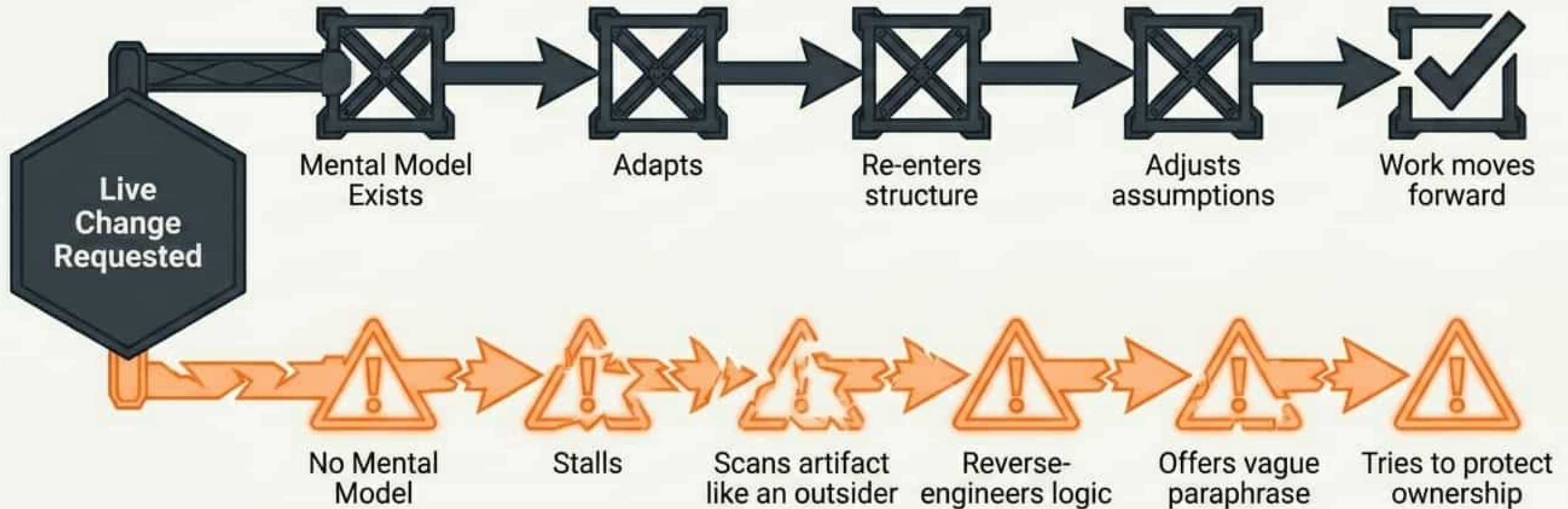


Model B: Proximity



Production can be proxied; navigation must be carried. When an artifact is asked to answer back in real-time—a live tweak, a changed assumption—the seam becomes visible. Artifacts without comprehension do not survive live contact.

Paying the defense tax



The **defense tax** is the cognitive burden of trying to protect ownership of work you cannot comfortably inhabit. The person is no longer working with the artifact; they are defending a claim to it.

Distinguishing the relationship to the tool

We cannot govern the instrument; we must govern the relationship to it.
The tool is identical. The relationship is not.

	Curiosity-Driven Use	Substitution-Driven Use
Relationship to Tool	Open, discussable, used to think against.	Concealed, used to vanish while preserving signature.
Live-Edit Performance	Mental model exists; may need a moment to surface.	Structural gap; logic never settled in the person.
The Goal	Comprehension and stress-testing.	Polished surface passing inspection.
Post-Failure Pivot	Sits forward, discloses, adjusts workflow.	Doubles down, minimizes, defends the surface.

Organizations get the AI use they deserve



Substitution thrives in cultures that reward individual genius over collaborative sensemaking, polished deliverables over inhabitable method, and speed over comprehension.

If you celebrate a gleaming presentation without ever asking how it was built, you have issued unwritten invitation to substitute.

The generic helpfulness problem

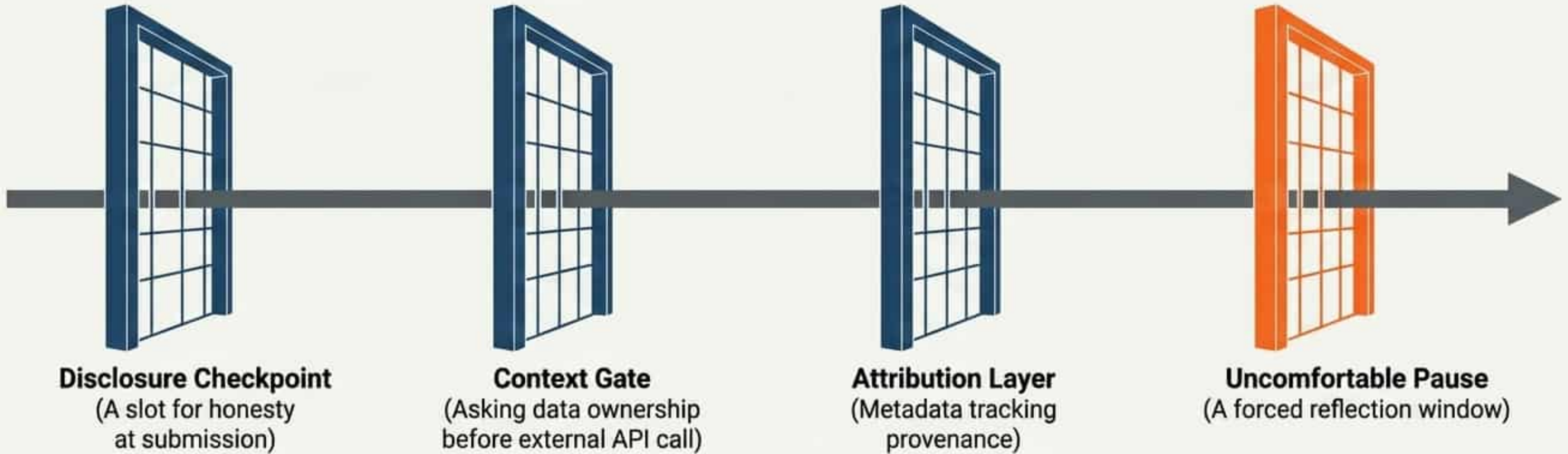


Input Field

The AI tool is unhelpfully, comprehensively, generically helpful. It processes the request because that is what it does. It does not know your NDA, your donor privacy agreements, or your data sovereignty protocols. The system lacks a conscience. But worse, the workflow lacks an interface for the conscience that already exists in the institution.

Designing the architecture of conscience

Pressure erodes individual conscience first. At 10:47 PM on a deadline, the distance between possession and transmission is a single paste operation.



We must build deliberate, well-placed friction into the interface.
Designing the right choice to be easier than the wrong one.

The pause is not a waiting room; it is a mirror. It is a designated slot in the interface for the knowledge you already have to reach the surface before the action is irreversible.

The compliance surface versus inhabitation

Architecture is necessary but insufficient. A worker can click through every friction point, context gate, and pause the way a commuter walks through a turnstile—touching the surface without occupying the space.

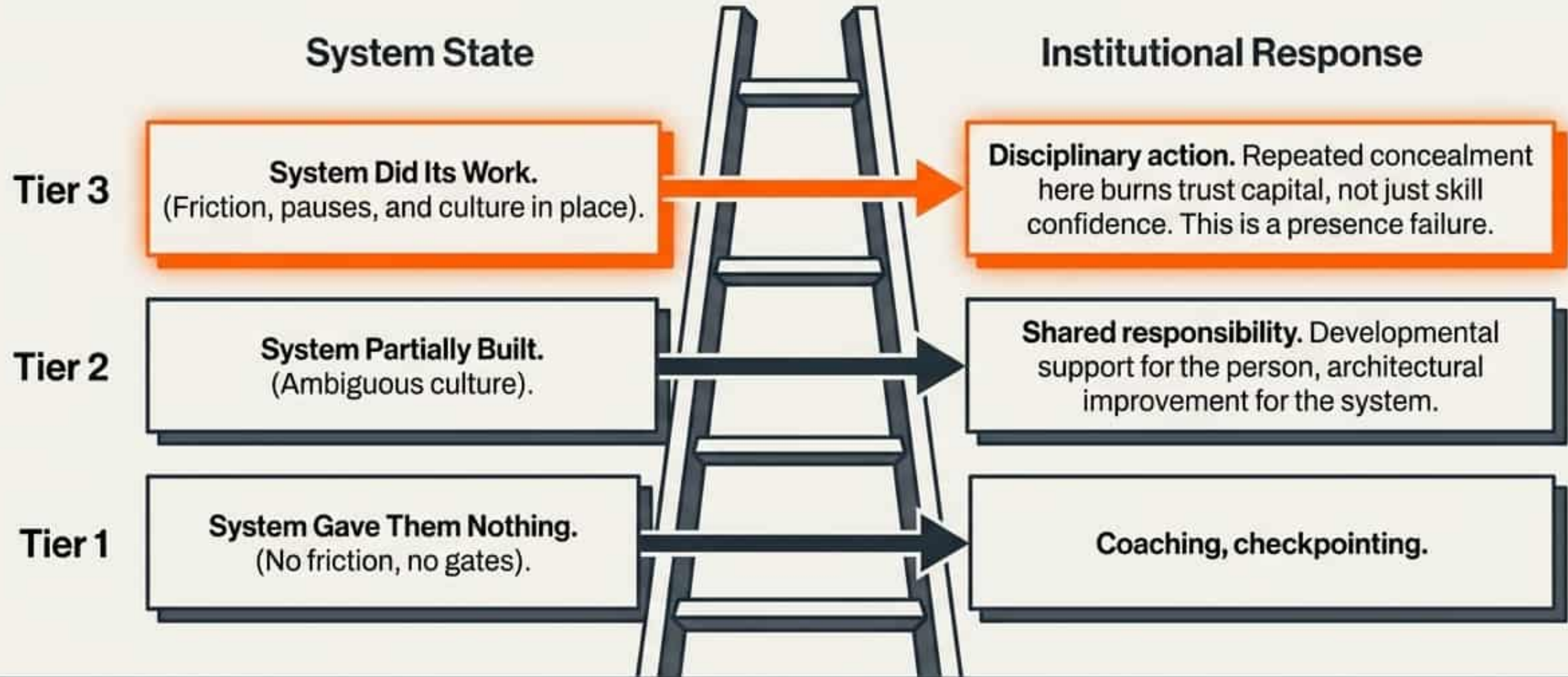

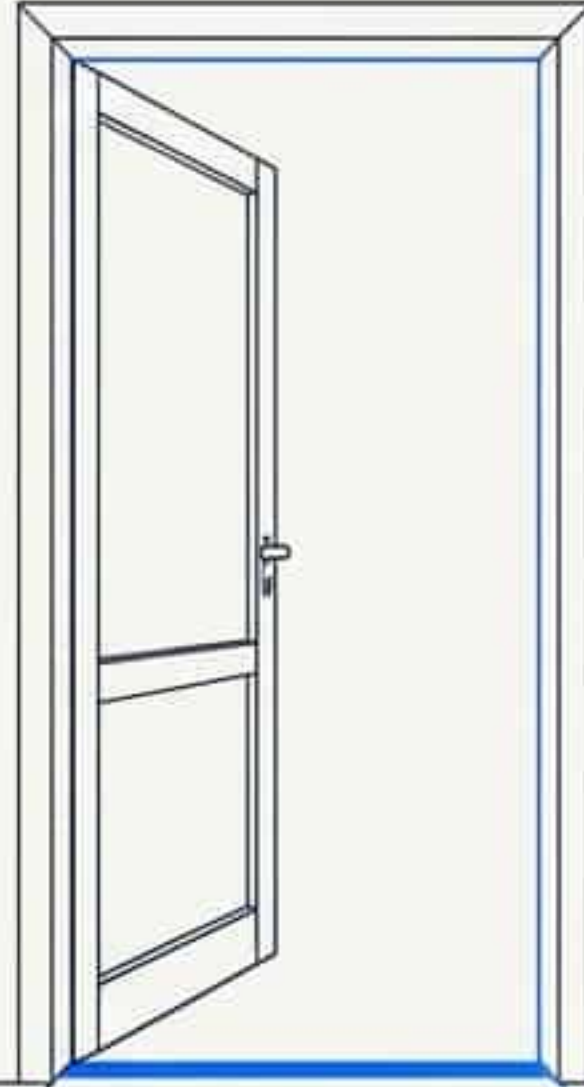

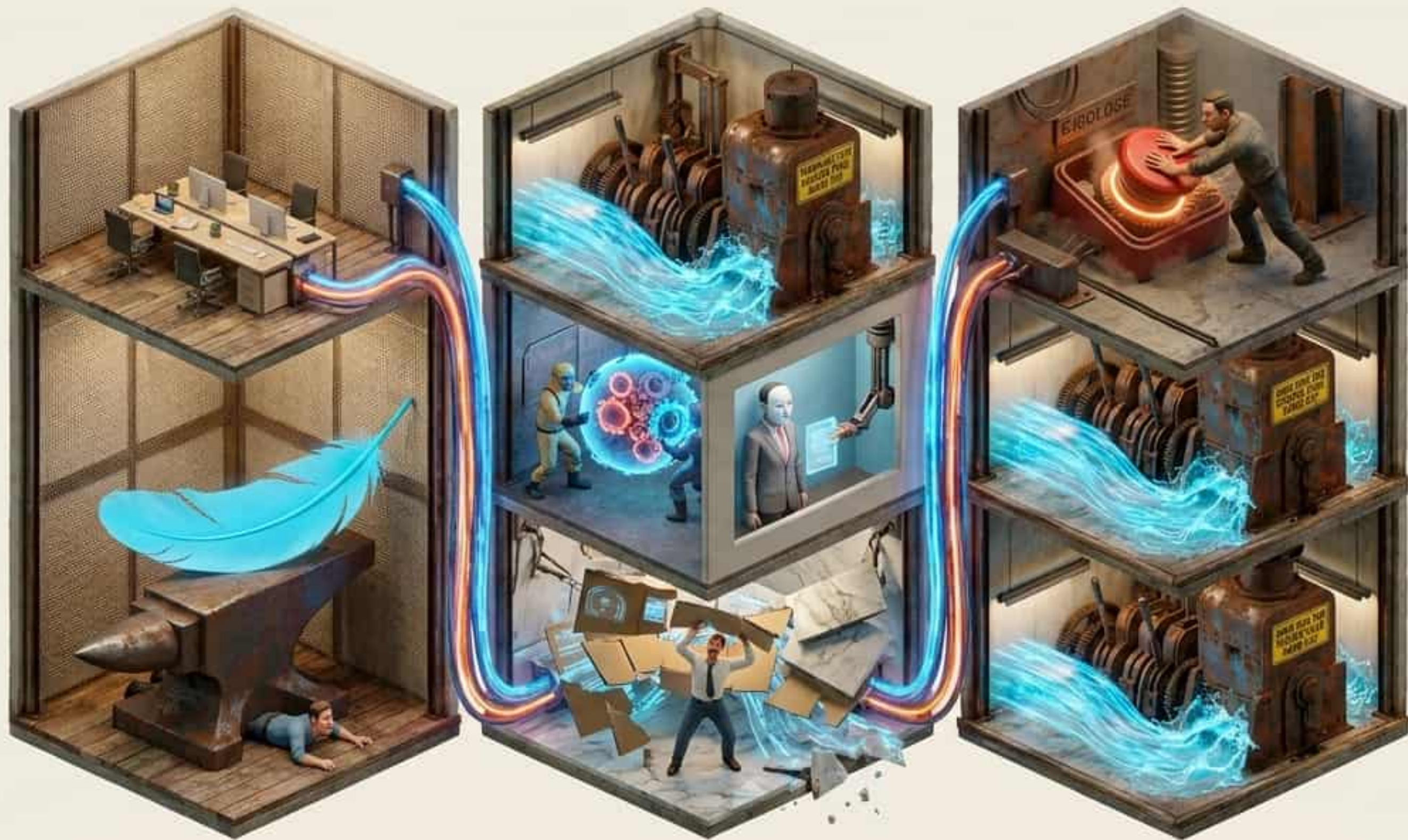

The AI use was just the occasion. The absence of professional identity was the reason. The real question is not how to catch the next person, but what institutional architecture turns undisclosed use into a governance surface instead of a betrayal.

Artifacts without comprehension: Locating the seam

Remote work provides
enough distance for the

In person, the room

Before evidence exists, there is institutional discomfort. A vague sense that the numbers are fine, but the rhythm is off. The work is present. The worker, in some essential sense, is not.

Apply **Generous Suspicion**. Calibration opens with inquiry, not accusation.
Keep detection inside the social contract.

The Live-Edit Test verifies agency, not just artifacts



The Risk

Production can now be proxied. Navigation still has to be carried... Generative AI makes the seam more common, cheaper, and easier to hide behind.

The Verification

The test asks a professional question: Can the person who submitted the work explain it, adapt it, and remain oriented once the thing has to change in motion?

If your name is on it, you must be able to carry its logic.

The Defense Tax: Distinguishing possession from proximity



The mental model exists.

The person connects with the logic and moves with the structure.

The logic never settled.

The person scans, stalls, and reverse-engineers the artifact to protect ownership of work they cannot comfortably inhabit.

The Defense Tax is the cognitive burden of preserving surface continuity when underlying comprehension is missing.

Substitution is outsourced presence

The system generated the surface. The worker supplied the signature. The relationship to AI is concealed, surface-oriented, and performance-driven.



Substitution thrives in cultures that reward individual genius over collaborative sensemaking, and speed over comprehension.

If your best people are hiding their process, the problem is not only the people. Organizations get the AI use they deserve.

The Missing Signal: Generic helpfulness and the 10:47 PM problem



The AI tool is unhelpfully, comprehensively, generically helpful. It does not know your NDA, your data sovereignty obligations, or your donor privacy agreements.

Pressure erodes individual conscience first. When the distance between “I have this data” and “a cloud-based system is now processing it” is a single paste operation, governance has already failed.

The conscience must live in the machinery

Designing the Interface of Conscience



The Disclosure Checkpoint.

A mandatory field attached to submission. Changes the default from silence to declaration.

The Context Gate.

A forced pause before pasting external data. Asks: "Who owns this data?"

The Attribution Layer.

Metadata flags that track provenance, shifting the review conversation.

The Uncomfortable Pause.

A mandatory 30-second wait before final endorsement.

The Uncomfortable Pause

“What am I signing my name to?”

Thirty seconds is not long. It is long enough for the body to notice things the workflow was too fast to let it feel.



The pause is not a waiting room. It is a mirror. It is a designed moment for the knowledge you already have to reach the surface before the action is irreversible.

Architecture without inhabitation is compliance theater



Imagine the institution has done everything right. The friction is placed. The gates are built. And someone clicks through every single mechanism the way a commuter walks through a turnstile. Touching the surface. Not occupying the space.

Architecture is necessary, but insufficient. It creates the conditions for responsible practice. It does not create the practice.

The Consequence Matrix: Mapping failure to system status

	System Status: Absent (No friction, no support).	Failure Mode: Training Gap.	Appropriate Response: Coaching & Retraining. You cannot punish someone for failing to navigate a workflow you never built.
	System Status: Partial (Ambiguous culture, mixed signals).	Failure Mode: Workflow Gap.	Appropriate Response: Shared Responsibility. Developmental support for the person; architectural improvement for the system.
	System Status: Built (Friction exists, amnesty offered).	Failure Mode: Presence Failure (Substitution).	Appropriate Response: Disciplinary Action / Termination. The obligation was clear, the support was available, and concealment was chosen.

The Residual Obligation



The person owes the system their actual presence. Their willingness to treat the friction as meaningful rather than decorative.
Their honesty in the disclosure field. Their genuine engagement with the pause.

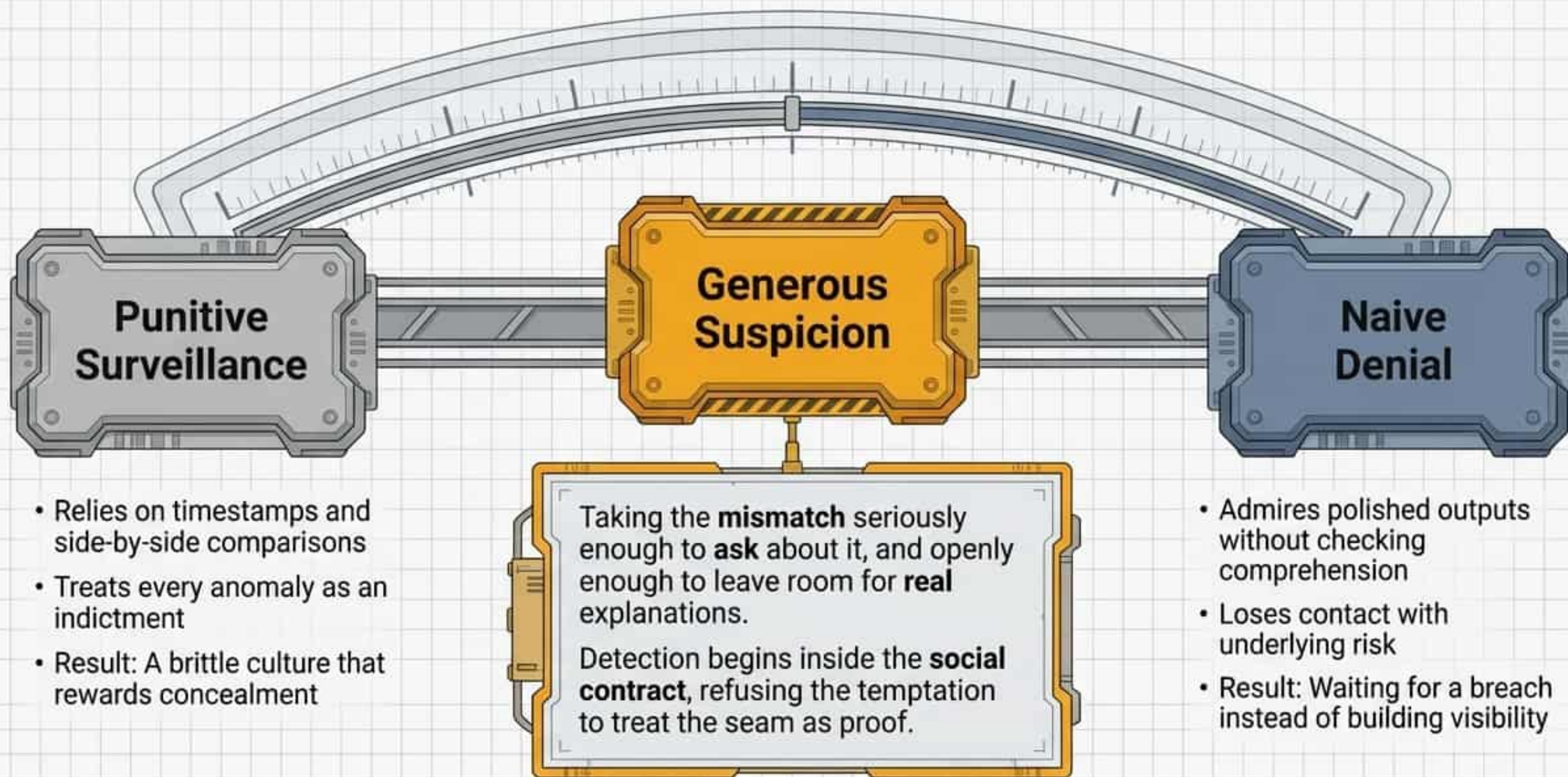

The Underlying Fracture

An organization used an AI system to write a workplace accountability anthem about an employee fired for using an AI system without accountability.

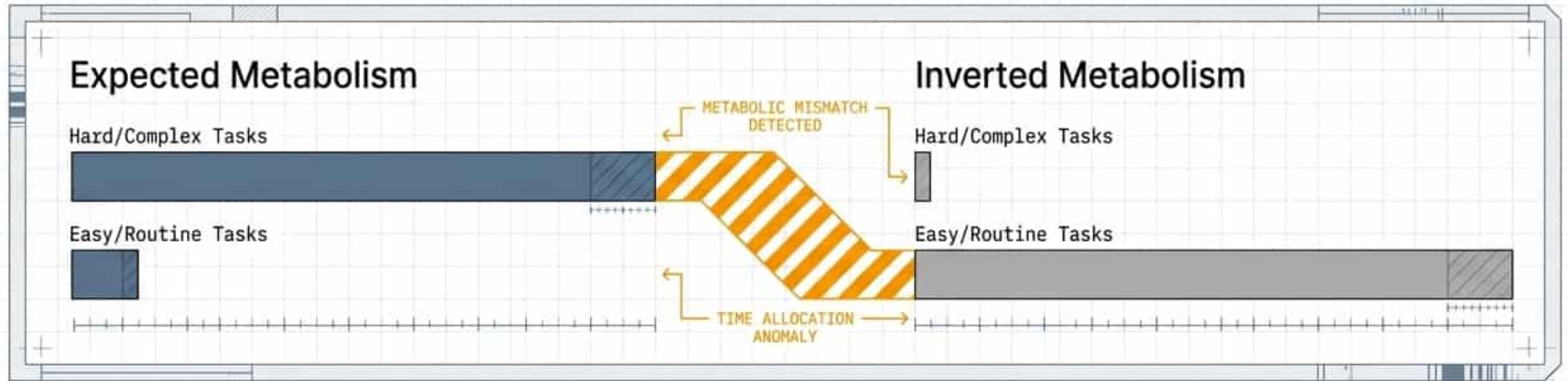
The machine composed the termination notice, but nobody noticed the irony.

Core Insight: It wasn't an AI issue. It was an absence of professional identity.



Signal 1: The Speed Inversion

Tempo as evidence. Real work has a metabolism.



The Technical-Communicative Split

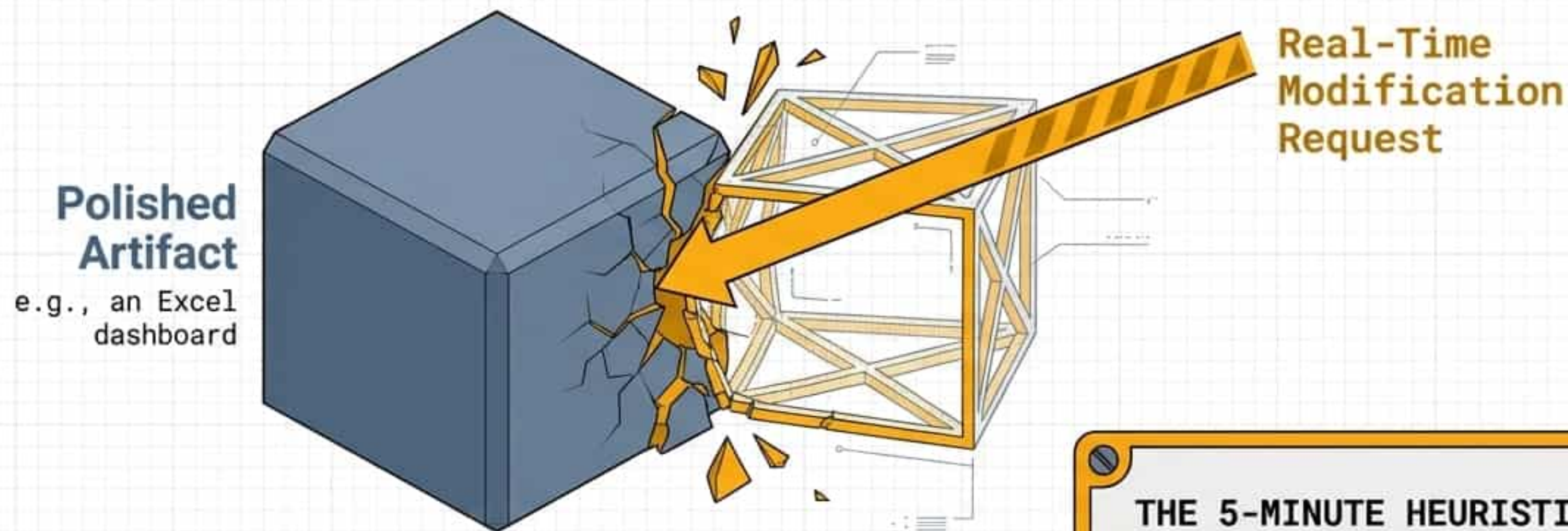
Complex coded tools arrive instantly; basic client emails take disproportionately long.

The Creative-Analytical Inversion

Concept notes sing instantly; grounded, procedural follow-through trudges.

Signal 2: The Live-Edit Test

Shifting from Artifact to Agency. Can the person navigate the logic live?

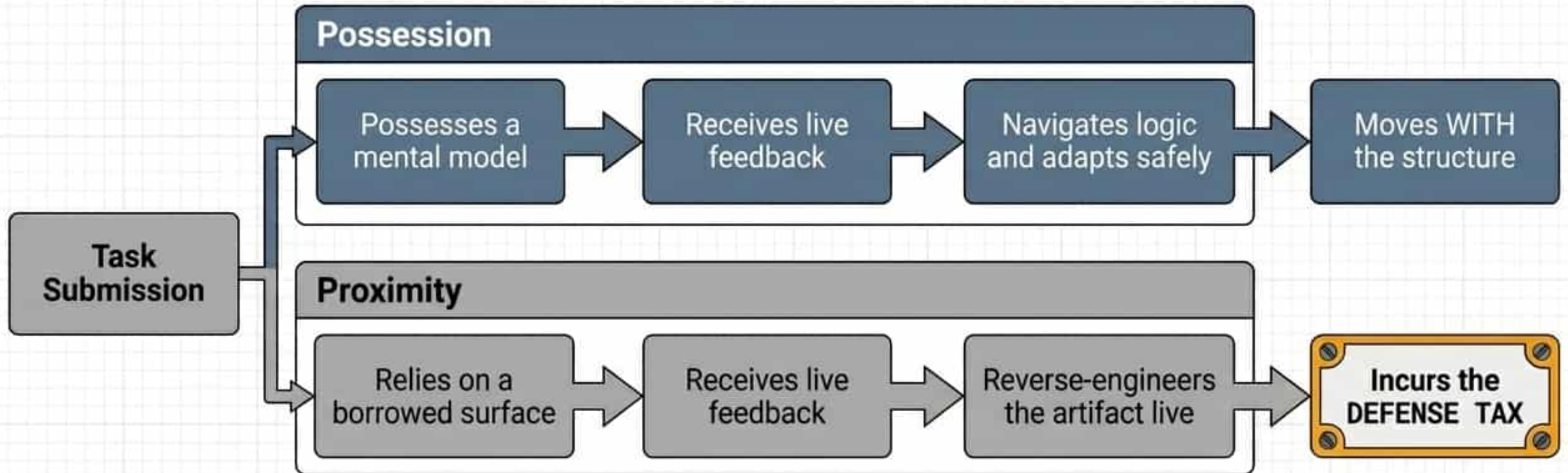

THE 5-MINUTE HEURISTIC

If someone cannot locate the logic of the work within a few minutes of live exploration, the issue is not poor memory. The issue is weak possession.

The Defense Tax



Definition: The Defense Tax

The cognitive burden of trying to protect ownership of work you cannot comfortably inhabit. Shows up as delay, vagueness, and over-managed composure.

Curiosity vs. Substitution

The defining professional distinction of the next decade.

	Curiosity-Driven	Substitution-Driven
Approach	Thinks AGAINST the tool. Uses it to stress-test hypotheses.	Outsourcing presence. The goal is a finished surface that passes inspection.
Relationship to Artifact	The mental model exists; the tool extends thinking.	The system generates the surface; the worker supplies the signature.
Reaction to Failure	Fails a live-edit temporarily; can reconnect to the logic.	Structural gap. No mental model waiting to reconnect. 
Disclosure	Shows the seams voluntarily because that's where the learning happened. 	Concealed. Defensive when questioned.

1. A culture rewards polished deliverables over inhabitable method.

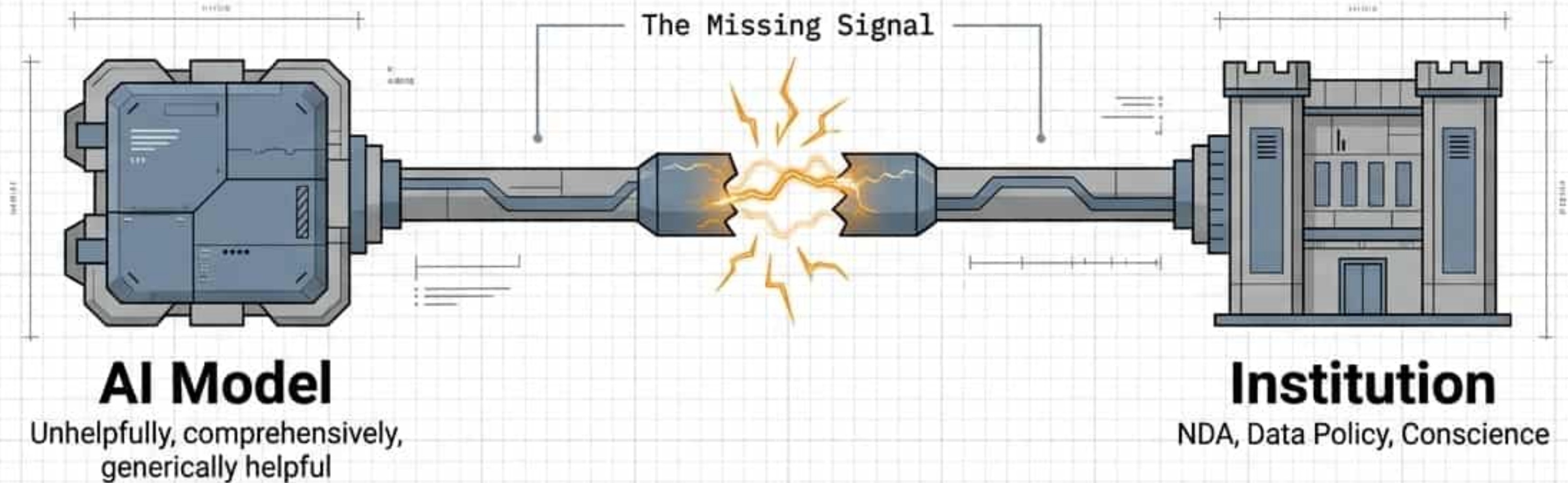
2. It celebrates the gleaming midnight deck without ever asking “how did you build this?”

The Missing Signal

The structural gap between the tool and the organization.

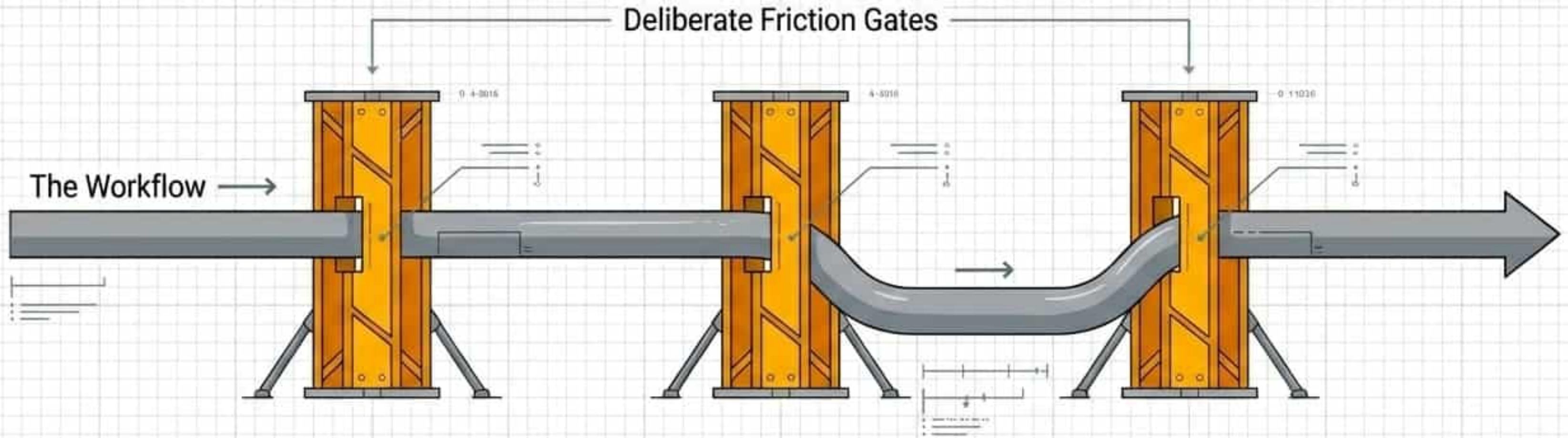


Time: 10:47 PM.

The funder report is due. The data is on the clipboard. The policy is in a shared drive. The compliance officer went home at 5 PM.

Under deadline pressure, conscience erodes first. The system processed the request, and the workflow continued without a single check.

The Interface of Conscience

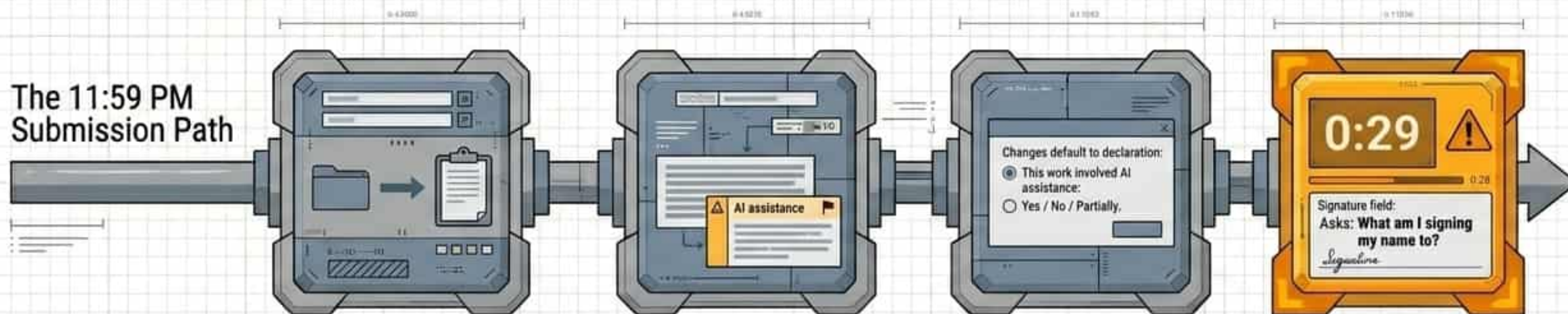


The conscience cannot live solely in a policy manual or an individual's fatigued mind. It must live in the machinery. Not as surveillance, but as deliberate, well-placed friction that arrives at the moment of decision.

Call to Action:

- Design the workflow so that the right choice is easier than the wrong one.
- Build the pause where the pressure is highest.

The Four Friction Points



1. The Context Gate (Pre-Generation)

Interrupts clipboard flow. Asks: Who owns this data?

2. The Attribution Layer (During Generation)

Metadata tracks provenance. Flags sections claiming human authorship.

3. The Disclosure Checkpoint (At Submission)

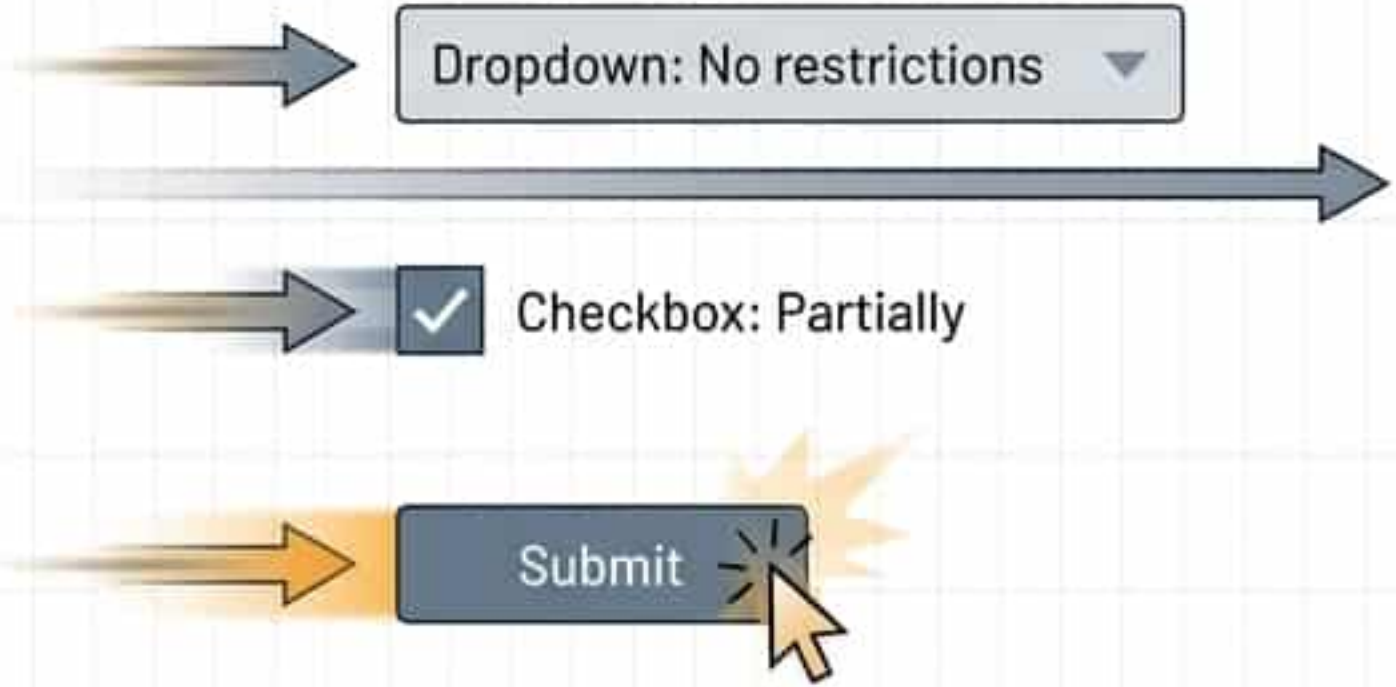
Changes default to declaration: This work involved AI assistance: Yes / No / Partially.

4. The Uncomfortable Pause (Final Sign-Off)

Mandatory 30-second screen wait. Asks: What am I signing my name to?

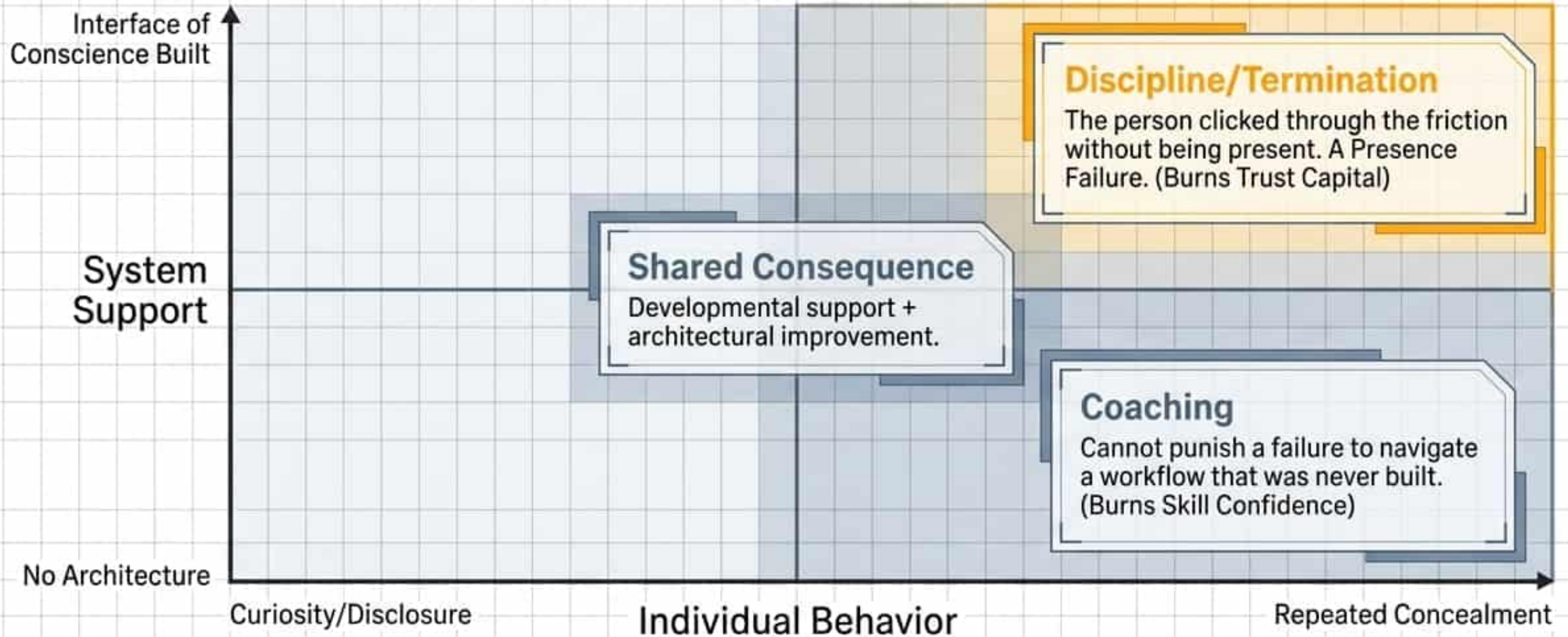
Compliance vs. Inhabitation

Architecture is necessary but insufficient.

Compliance (Touching the surface)	Inhabitation (Being present for the mechanism)

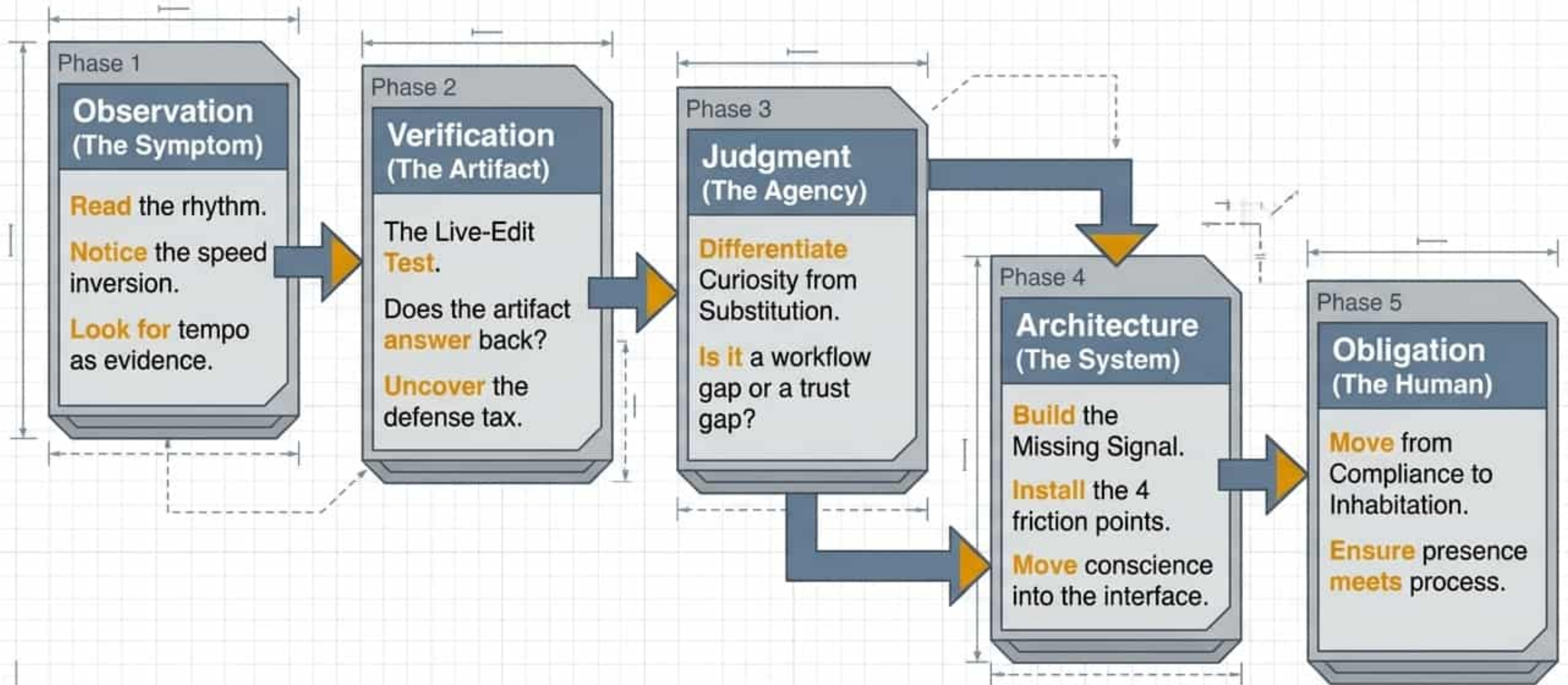
Architecture creates the conditions for responsible practice. It cannot make anyone reflect. The pause is not a waiting room; it is a mirror.

The Forgiveness Gradient



Key Insight: Trust capital is a finite resource. A spectacular firing is usually evidence of an earlier design failure.
